## TROPHY STILLWATER OF THE EASTERN SIERRA

Let me take you on a grand tour of three of the best trophy trout fisheries we have in the Eastern Sierra. We will cover Kirman Lake, the Best Brook Trout fishery in California. We will cover Heenan Lake which is a brood stock lake for the Lahontan Cutthroat Trout. Finally Crowley Lake, which in my humble opinion is the best and possibly the most perfect stillwater we have for trout. I will cover history of each individual lake including elevations, size, depth, when the lake was started and seasons and regulations. I will break down and discuss bugs, food items and what the best flies to use to be successful at each stillwater. Also leader systems, water craft and specific rods to give you the best advantage possible on each body of water.



### Who is Ernie Gulley?

Ernie has spent most of his life in southern California. He started fishing with his father from the time he could walk. At age seven he moved to New Orleans, LA. and learned how to fish Lake Ponchartrain for speckled trout and other salt water species. He returned to southern California with a passion and love affair for fishing. He started fishing the stillwaters of the High Sierra's including Crowley Lake and Bridgeport reservoir. He also fished many lakes in Utah, Idaho and Nevada. During this time he fished exclusively with "Noodle Sticks" which are (IFGA) rated two pound class ultra light rods. His hunt for big fish on light lines had begun. In 1997 he became intrigued with fly fishing and January of 1998 he purchased his first fly rod. He fell in love with fly fishing and has never looked back. In 2006 he joined the Deep Creek Fly Fishers Club in Riverside. He became one of the principal instructors in fly tying and classes on "Stillwater Fly Fishing Tactics". In 2007 he won the famous "Double Hall in the Fall" tournament at Crowley Lake. In 2008 and 2009 he placed second in the "Stillwater Classic" in the team category also at Crowley Lake. Currently he is a licensed, insured and bonded guide in California specializing

in stillwater fly fishing tactics. His home water is Crowley Lake, where he is one of the premier guides using his 22 foot Skeeter Bay Boat for his fly fishing platform, however he guides all over the Eastern Sierra and Southern California. You will be hard pressed to find anyone who has more energy, enthusiasm, love and passion for teaching stillwater fly fishing tactics. He has spoken to almost every fly fishing club in California, along with Fly Fishing Shows, Fly Fishing Fairs, Fly Fishing Shops on specific stillwaters and teaches many Stillwater Clinics. 



A sign-up sheet will be available at monthly meetings where you can choose which month to bring the goodies.


